

Message from our Senior Pastor ~

Jesus Is Able

"As Jesus went on from there, two blind men followed him, calling out, 'Have mercy on us, Son of David!' When (Jesus) had gone outdoors, the blind men came to him, and he asked them, 'Do you believe that I am able to do this?' 'Yes Lord,' they replied. Then Jesus touched their eyes and said, 'According to your faith it will be done to you'; and their sight was restored." Matthew 9:27-30

We live in a world that doesn't seem to trust a whole lot anymore. Why should we? Our culture has proven time and time again that few, if any, are to be trusted when it comes to our lives and the relationships we have surrounding us. With that in mind, many get involved in friendships and marriages already expecting to see it dissolve because, as they say, "that's just the way it is today." It's easy to see why trust is at an all-time low when you look around.

Thank God for Jesus!

Jesus came to our broken world to redeem us and to let us know that there is someone whom we can trust. Please reread the text above. The two blind men, in faith, believed that Jesus was the Son of God and able to heal them. They trusted that Jesus could do something out of the ordinary, to make people see. Even though their lives were far from perfect, they looked for mercy instead of cursing at Jesus for their hard life. What did they receive? The gift of sight. Now you may not see any similarities to your own lives, but they are there. At the center of this text is the question of trust. Jesus asked, "Do you believe that I am able to do this?" He asks us the same question today. Do you believe that I am able to comfort you at the loss of a loved one? Do you believe that I am able to restore your relationship that seems to be headed for separation or divorce? Do you believe I am able to give you the strength to stop this addiction? Do you believe that I am able to save you? These are tough questions, yet Jesus has an answer for these and all the other questions that face us daily. "Yes, I am able."

This brings me to an important question. Do you trust Him? Do you trust that Jesus is who He says He is and that He has done what He says He has done? If yes, and I pray it is for all of you, are you willing to trust Him with your lives? Trusting someone makes us vulnerable to them, but we needn't worry when it comes to trusting Jesus. He came because He loved us and wanted us to live eternally with Him in heaven. He is able to bring peace to our lives. He is able to give us balance as we live in this untrusting world. Trust Him in this! He is able! God give you the strength to believe in all things that Jesus is able.

Message from our Associate Pastor ~

The grass withers and the flower fades, but the word of the Lord endures forever. -Isaiah 40:8

We're entering the fall season! Things have picked up here at St. Martin as the building is full of children, families, and staff. The childcare, school, and church are continuing to do well. Our new teachers and staff are just starting to settle into their new roles and Principal Ferg has done an excellent job on the school side. Jen Lang is also doing a wonderful job over at the daycare. And Pastor Jason and I have relaunched our regular slate of Bible studies. Because part of our desired future here at St. Martin is to solidify and maintain the unity of our ministries, it's good to see that there is so much involvement across our three areas of ministry.

One thing that particularly impressed me as the pastor here at St. Martin is the response we had at our open house meetings. You, the members of our congregation, showed up strong—over 100 people across the three nights! So I wanted to say thank you for being a part of those events. It was helpful to us as a staff as we try to organize our projects in the coming months.

But beyond all that, this has been a challenging month for our country. The assassination of conservative activist Charlie Kirk shocked the nation. Many of those in our congregation enjoyed his discussions, videos, and work. As I have been praying and reflecting on the event, I have mostly been mourning and concerned for our nation. We live in an age that is not immune to violence. Pray to our God that he keep our country from descending into more political violence. What often happens after an event like this is that more and more violence occurs, and it can spin out of control.

God gave us Christ Jesus as the means of reconciliation and peace. We are called to be ambassadors of this reconciliation through Christ (2 Cor 5:20). How do we go on in a world that glories in violence and hatred? God's saints follow Christ where he leads—to the cross. I am reminded of a quote from Luther: "I do not know where God's path leads, but I know well my Guide." Christ is the one who goes to the lost sinner not with violence, but suffers for the sake of the sinner he wants to reconcile to himself.

Whether the future holds great horrors, great joys, or continues on in some strange holding pattern, it is not ours to know. It is ours to know him who loved us so greatly that he went to the cross, scorning the

shame, and reconciling us to God. He will lead us through to the end. Because in the end, the grass withers, flowers fade, nations rise and fall. But the word of the Lord endures forever.

Goal: To show love at all times through words and actions, even when it's hard.

- 2. All means all. Loving friends when they are nice is easy. Loving friends who are annoying, mean to you, or act differently than you, is really hard.

- 4. Show love through your actions. We've all heard the phrase "actions speak louder than words." Our actions are the exclamation point to our words. Don't just talk the talk, walk the walk!
