Finally, we are excited to welcome **Trixie**, the newest member of Concordia's Comfort Dog team. Trixie serves in the Veteran Services office and was trained at a facility in Iowa. The staff there are enthusiastic to become part of the expanding comfort dog ministry on our campus.
