Currently, there is a change taking place with The Science of Reading and schools are changing the way reading is being taught based on research. There are many benefits to reading. 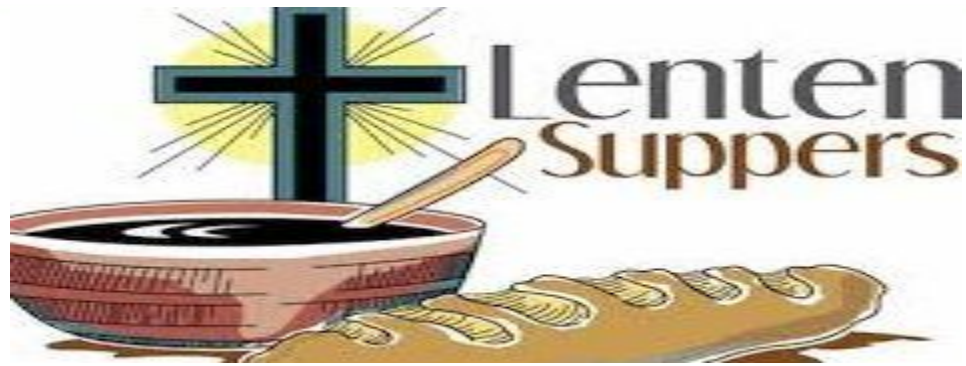
